Proving Family Connections

Recently I was asked to research the family of Henry Zart and his wife Julia Ples. All that was known about this couple was the names of their children and whom they married. I was not given any information about where they lived. I set out to learn more about this couple and find out where they were from.

I found Henry Zart with his wife and family in the 1921 Canadian Census at Vancouver. It confirmed the names of the children and approximate ages of everyone in the family. I did a search for the family at familysearch.org and learned that Henry died just a few years later in Vancouver in September 1923. His death registration indicated the family was now living at Deroche, BC. It only listed his father as C. Zart.

Next I located what I thought was Henry's wife Julia arriving in Canada with son Henry in 1911. She was listed as Julie and her son Heinrich (Henry is the anglicized version of Heinrich). It is not a very common name and the ages fit the information I found in the census records. It looked like she was travelling with other family members (Christof and Christina Zart with their daughter Christina), possibly Henry's parents and

sister but I needed to confirm these relationships. I found the same family (without Julia and her son Henry) going across the border to the US in 1913 to visit a son named Jacob Zart in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

I established that Christof and Christina Zart lived in Saskatchewan by finding them in the 1916 Prairie Census at Moose Jaw. This confirmed that they didn't stay in the US with their son Jacob. Next I found a grave marker in the Regina Cemetery with the name C. Zart (1859-1924) at www.findagrave.com. Also listed on the marker was an E. Dubois (1914-1935). Was this Christof or his wife Christina and who was E. Dubois?

I still needed to confirm who Henry's parents were. I did another search for the Zart name at FamilySearch but this time I limited the records to just those in Canada. In the results was a probate record for Christina Zart in Saskatchewan dated 1924. This was an original record and it contained 46 pages. I was able to confirm that her husband was Christof Zart and that she had three children: sons Jacob and Heinrich and a daughter Christina. Daughter Christina was married with last name Dubois. The probate goes into great details about the children of Christof and Christina Zart and talks about where they were living and that both sons were

now deceased (as of 1924). It says the son Heinrich died in Vancouver in September 1923.

After finding the probate for Christina Zart in Regina, I thought I would try my luck with finding one for Henry in Vancouver. I found an entry for an estate record for him at the BC Archives in their textual records database and wrote down the information for future research. By chance, I looked at the records at FamilySearch once more and found BC Estate Files, 1859-1949 were online but they weren't indexed yet. I had to browse through the entries until I found Henry's estate file. This confirmed that his wife was Julie/Julia and gave a list of all the children they had. I was finally able to establish family connections by using a set of records that were not readily available previously.
