British Columbia City Directories: A Gold Mine of Information Part One

What do we know of the cities and towns earlier generations lived in? If we are researching in BC and the Yukon we have the illuminating resource known as the British Columbia city directories. These directories are available online at Vancouver Public Library www.vpl.ca/bccd/index/php. The directories are available online from 1860 to 1955. Copies of the books themselves are also available in some locations such as Cloverdale Library.

The directories contain detailed historical information about BC (and eventually Yukon) communities — street and name listings of individuals and businesses, government, population, newspapers, schools, libraries, and so much more. They document the growth of BC and the Yukon, and also contain advertisements and illustrations which provide insight into the times.

The 1860 San Francisco Department Directory states in the Introduction: "California is now, and ever will be, the only reliable mart from which these colonies can be supplied with the necessaries and commodities." The indexes to both the Victoria and

San Francisco departments list merchants and businesses in San Francisco.

By 1863 the *BC Guide and Directory* focused primarily on Victoria with an alphabetical list of individuals, addresses and occupations. It included a description of New Westminster (the capital of BC) and the Fraser River — businesses and government offices. The Colony of BC section lists Hudson's Bay Company Stations and "the Gentlemen in Charge"; salaries of various government officials including His Excellency James Douglas, CB, Governor and Commander-in-Chief; revenue, customs duties, laws, meteorological records; and under BC Towns: the names and occupations of residents in places such as Douglas, Richfield and Antler.

In 1877-1878 we have the *Guide to the Province of BC* which includes information on climate, beasts, birds and fish, land grants requirements, the Chinook Dictionary (a "Dictionary of the Chinook Jargon, Indian Trade Language of the North Pacific Coast"). We see the expansion of settlements through the growing list of residents and businesses.

The "City of Vancouver — Terminus of the CPR" is mentioned in the 1887 directory. Along with a geographical description there are market reports listing the price of food items, shipments from Hastings Sawmill, and fraternal organizations. The Table of Salmon Canneries shows where salmon was caught and then where, nationally and internationally, the almost 171,000 cases were shipped.
