### The Evolution of a Citizen

The Maple Ridge Family History Group was requested by the Maple Ridge Historical Society to form a research team to search for answers to the following questions:

- What can be found about Edmund Pope before he came to Maple Ridge?
- What is the relationship with St. John the Divine Anglican Church and the Pope Family?

The Maple Ridge Museum and Community Archives provided information currently held on the Edmund Pope family to launch the project.

Research for such a project begins with developing a rough outline of the family tree involved. Census records add to the frame to flesh out the tree and locations. From this point, other records are brought in such as newspapers, voter's lists, council minutes and more to add dimension. Once the main records have been collected, they are scrutinized for the accuracy and discrepancies.

By this time, a basic idea of what pieces of information are relevant to the initial questions has been discovered, and what holes in the story there are. While the final product is taking shape, other members continue to search for information which might enhance the story. When the final product is in draft shape, research work is suspended.

The outcome after many hours of research has resulted in capturing much of the Cornwall, England family history, the family's Maple Ridge years, an insight into the family's connection to St. John the Divine Anglican Church and much more on Edmund Pope and the many positions he held during his employment with the District of Maple Ridge.



*Edmund Pope arrived in Canada in 1887 from Cornwall, England. He made his way to Maple Ridge to join his older sister, Mary Jane and her husband, John Henry Laity. Edmund's wife Eleanor arrived in 1889 with their daughter, Edith. The family eventually settled on acreage on River Road, just east of St. John the Divine Anglican Church. Their son, John Arnold was born in 1891.*

*Community involvement was inevitable, considering Edmund Pope's employment with the District of Maple Ridge. Although he held many positions with the District until age 70, the most notable was Maple Ridge's first police constable.*

This is the second community history project undertaken by the Maple Ridge Family History Group. In 2015/16 a team researched the early families of William Frederick Edge and Samuel Edge. Information gathered for that project was presented in 2016 and is filed with the Maple Ridge Museum and Archives.

## Maple Ridge Council Minutes

Hurray! The 1931–1938 Council Minutes are now available for viewing in the City of Maple Ridge website! This means that all council minutes, which are stored in the city's archives, from the beginning of the District of Maple Ridge in 1874 all the way to 1951 are now accessible as well as the Bylaw book from 1874–1913. While it is not a blockbuster in reading, it does give a unique view of the development of many of the governmental institutions progressions, from policing, to public health, to roadways. This new addition will be especially interesting as Reeve Mussallem was dealing with social welfare as the depression dragged on and the development of the road system. He drafted a few interesting letters to the Provincial government.

History books are good for demonstrating how events affected the mass population but council minutes give better examples of how the smaller communities were affected.
