The Haney Family — A Different Perspective

The Maple Ridge Family History Group's most recent community history project deals with the Haney family. The Haneys are arguably the best known pioneer family name in Maple Ridge; a great deal of information is known about them, and has been written about them. How to bring something new to the table and, perhaps, tell their story from a different perspective? Let's start with where they came from before arriving in what is today Maple Ridge.

Thomas Haney's father, Dennis and his grandfather, Thomas Hanlon were both early Irish settlers to Cape Breton Island. They are listed in the 1838 Census for Cape North. Both were fisherman — Thomas Hanlon had a household of eight and Dennis Haney was single. By 1839, Dennis Haney was married to Thomas Hanlon's daughter, Bridget. The couple settled into farming in the Aspy Bay area and by 1849, they had seven children.

Dennis died in a drowning accident in the spring of 1849, leaving Bridget to pack up her seven young children and move to Oxford County, Ontario to join her father and other family.

Thomas Haney married Anne Callaghan, the daughter of another Irish immigrant, Daniel Callaghan, 14 October 1873. This was the beginning of an

enterprising life for both families. In 1876, Thomas Haney was joined by his father-in-law, Daniel and brothers-in-law, Daniel Thomas and John on a journey that would bring them to Wickwire's Landing, today's Maple Ridge. Finding the location ideal, Anne joined her husband in 1877 with their young daughter, Mary Florence and brother, Jeremiah.

This would be the last leg of the journey for Thomas Haney and his extended family.

Five more children were born to Thomas and Anne in Port Haney. Daughter Mary Florence died of diphtheria at age 11, three days after the birth of her youngest sister Margaret Maud Mae.

The Haney family were devout Catholics and were instrumental in the building of the first two St Patrick's Roman Catholic Church buildings. They set aside land for Catholic burials at Maple Ridge Cemetery. Anne collected donations for construction of the first church. Amongst other endeavours, Thomas and son Daniel Thomas worked in the community for decades on road building and maintenance. Thomas was instrumental in the establishment of a Port Haney Water Works system that Daniel and his wife managed for a number of years. The Haneys and their extended family became community builders in the growth and development of Maple Ridge.

Did we bring a fresh perspective to the Haney family? You decide. Our presentation, with additional information both before and after the family's arrival in Maple Ridge, will be unveiled at the **Heritage Awards** on February 22nd at 7:00 pm (see page 2 for details). The presentation will be on display at the Maple Ridge Library after February 22nd.
