Books and Tricks

For Christmas I received the much anticipated *The diary of Jane Ellice* edited by Patricia Godsell, published in 1975. On Nov. 4, 1838 Jane talks about being taken captive by rebel insurgents at the Beauharnois Seigneury in Lower Canada (Quebec). Ellice and her household were kept prisoners until Nov. 10, when they were freed by troops. In this series of entries Jane mentions a Mrs. Usher with 2 children.


Indeed a prisoner's life is not an agreeable one. Besides our prison is so crowded - 62 people- some of them insufferably dirty, and squalling children in abundance, all spoilt and some of them sick, added to which we have Killdeer, Bess and Major in our little Cell. The Cure is as kind as possible. What spoilt children there are in the world. Mrs. Usher, with all her scolding, has a good a specimen of a spoilt child in her "Mary Jane my child" as one could wish to see. (page 142)

Mrs. Usher is my 3rd Great-grandmother Sarah Usher (nee Platt) and the spoiled Mary Jane my 2nd great-grandmother. I am assuming that the infant is George Beauchamp Ussher born 06 Jan 1838. Based on this entry it dawned on me that I should look in Quebec for Mary Jane's birth record rather than Ontario. I logged onto Ancestry.ca and went to the *Quebec Vital and*

Church Records (Drouin Collection), 1621-1967.

A simple search produced no results but I knew that her parents had been married at Montréal (Anglican Christ Church Cathedral, Actes) and based on later census records that Mary Jane was born in 1836.

The Drouin collection can be browsed by location and date; luckily for us, the priests and rectors indexed their own records and those have been digitized as well. So, I selected the parish and date and browsed to the index.



There she was under U.



I found page 34 and finally have the baptismal record for Mary Jane Ussher – indexed on Ancestry under "Ufsher" due to

the handwriting of Rector John Bethune.

I have used this technique to find other records for my family. If you have found one record for your family browse the original index for other years and see what you can find.
