On the Trail of the Clares

By using the Royal British Columbia Museum genealogy database

searchcollections.royalbcmuseum .bc.ca, I have been able to further my search for the relatives that are less known to the family. It is interesting what comes up in that search. Consider the trail of Helen McDonald Miller and Robert Clare.

I assumed that Helen and Robert were the parents of two sons, George Robert Clare and Richard Wilson Clare. On closer look, I realized the boys were born in the late 1910's yet the marriage of Helen and Robert was in Penticton in 1936. That meant there had to be another mother. Using the database, it was a quick summation to find the marriage of Robert to Alice Newhouse in Hedley in 1915. Poor woman, she must have died while the boys were still in their teens...or so I thought until I looked up her death certificate under Alice Clare.

Alice resided in Campbell River at the time of her death in 1966. She did not remarry. It wasn't until I looked very closely at her marriage certificate to Robert Clare that I discovered a handwritten notation directly below the document title. "Marriage dissolved at Vancouver BC on October 11, 1935". What a wonderful extra piece of information!

Now I just need to work carefully on the next generation for it will prove to be complicated. It turns out that while Helen McDonald Miller is my grand aunt [on my mother's father's side], her step son Richard Wilson Clare married Agnes Mureen Phillips who is also my grand aunt [on my mother's mother's side!].

Should I also mention that Helen's two brothers married two sisters who just happen to be sisters with Agnes Mureen...

More on the characters below...

Helen McDonald Miller was born in 1896 in Caithness Scotland. She ventured to Canada in 1928 with her widowed father. Murdoch Ross Miller and youngest brother James to join the rest of her siblings [with the exception of Peter who died in World War 1] and with the intention of immigrating. They joined the rest of the family in Coalmont British Columbia. She was 31 years old at that time and never had any children of her own. I suspect she took over the housekeeper role when her mother died in 1920. Brothers John Alexander and James married Phillips girls.

Robert Clare was born in 1892 in Cheshire England. He was a mechanic working in Blakeburn British Columbia around the time he met Helen. By this time period, his sons were men in their own right.

In 1934, John Albert Phillips moved his wife, four daughters and two sons to Coalmont.

Daughters Ellen and Evelyn married the Miller boys. Sister Agnes Mureen married Richard Wilson Clare.
