Supplies for Looking after your Documents

Putting the papers away is one of many chores that family historians fret about. Where to put them? How to track where they are stored? How to keep them safe?

I recently heard again the sad story of losing everything in a fire. If the photos had been scanned and shared the tragedy would have been minimized. So good back-up is essential.

But some papers are one-of-a-kind, often old and irreplaceable. To get started, I recommend we spend a little time and effort creating digital versions, writing good citation for them, and then putting them away in archivally safe storage.

To create safe storage we can usually use cheap, simple supplies:

- polyester sheet protectors
- acid-free copy paper to support frail documents in the sheet protectors
- polyester storage boxes
- acid-free pens

These materials can all be found at stationery, craft or art supply stores. Check the Staples web site product information for data about papers. Find photo storage at photo shops, and now even Canadian Tire. Most importantly, we need to be skeptical of any clerk telling us that material is acid-free. Read labels and ask questions to be sure you are choosing the best for your priceless family history.
