Researching Italian Records

I have been researching my Italian ancestors for a number of years and have used Family Search, which has an extensive collection of Italian genealogical records. Unfortunately most of these records have not been indexed meaning that we Italian researchers have had to resort to the laborious task of browsing through thousands of images in the hopes of getting a "hit". The good news is that earlier this year Family Search began a push to index Italian records.

I'm searching for my relatives in Paese, in the Province of Treviso in northern Italy. Paese is the administrative district where the vital events are registered for my relatives who lived in a smaller village. Copies of the vital records were subsequently forwarded to the provincial archive in the City of Treviso, Province of Treviso. I'm using the records for Italy, Treviso, Treviso Civil Registration (*Tribunale*) 1871-1941 which, unfortunately for my district of Paese, have only been copied from 1884 onwards. There are also records for *Italy*, *Treviso*, Treviso Civil Registration (State Archive) 1806-1815. At this time those missing years prior to 1884 have brought a halt to my backwards migration. I am still

culling through the thousands of images for Paese registrations and expect I will discover other relatives.

Italian vital records are a wonderful source of information. Not only do they contain the name and birth location of the individual, they record the names of the parents keeping the mother's birth name. This greatly increases the ability to confirm you are following the correct line, as well as taking you back another generation.

With this great resource, once I had my maternal grandfather's birth registration, I was able to confirm the names of his parents. Now I was able to locate my grandfather's siblings — I had known the names of a brother and sister, knew there was another brother, but previously did not know his name. I now have the birth registrations for my grandfather and his three siblings.

Once I had my grandfather's birth registration I was able to search for his parents' marriage record, which I located, as well as their marriage banns. These records named my greatgrandparents and therefore I've been able to go back yet another generation! Additionally, having the names of my greatgrandparents has enabled me to discover some records for their

other children, my grandparents' siblings.

Earlier I referred to the exercise of browsing images as laborious, and it certainly is. However, the advantage for me is that viewing each record has enabled me to find many ancestors I might not have identified otherwise.
