Searching Irish Vital Records at Irishgenealogy ie

Select Irish Vital Records went online on at Irish Genealogy.ie, www.irishgenealogy.ie/en, on September 8, 2016. I was very excited by this news because I've had difficulty researching my Gibson family in Portadown, County Armagh, Northern Ireland based on the lack of records available for Irish genealogy in general. Although I've made use of the Irish Vitals through the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on microfilm, I am so pleased they have posted them online where they can be accessed for free at this time.

Before you can view the records you must prove you're not a robot by answering a question based on a selection of pictures. Then you must provide them with your full name in the box provided in order to search the records based on Section 61 of the *Irish Civil Registration Act* of 2004. You will periodically be asked to do this again if you do numerous searches.

The records available to search at this time are: births from 1864–1915, marriages 1882–1940 and deaths 1891–1965. Eventually they will add records for marriages back to 1845 and deaths back to 1864.

My first search was to find the birth of Stewart Gibson, my grandmother's uncle, in 1866. I knew from previous research on the family that they registration district I needed for Portadown was Lurgan. The record for Stewart Gibson that is available at the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on microfilm had a piece of paper across his entry so I was unable to read it. I had info on when he was born in my grandmother's birthday book but I wanted proof of this date for my files. The version online was much clearer than the one I got from microfilm.

The information I gathered from the 1911 Census stated that Martha Gibson, the mother of Stewart Gibson, had 8 children with only 5 who were still living. I've only ever been able to locate 7 of those 8 children. One by one I searched for and located the birth entries for each child that I knew about. The entry for one son, Arthur born in 1870, contained a blank record for his birth. I will submit a request for his birth and see if I can get a copy of the original entry. And when they update the site with additional records I will go back online and search the deaths for the children who died young.
