McCord Museum's Online Collection

"The McCord Museum conserves and presents over 1,375,000 objects, images and manuscripts that are irreplaceable reflections of the social history and material culture of Montreal, Quebec and Canada. Currently, the "Keys to History" digital on-line collection -- created in collaboration with seven other museums -- is made up of 135,000 artifacts. Almost 117,000 artifacts held by the McCord and some 17,500 artifacts held by the partner museums are available for viewing."

I did a keyword search for the name PLATT. The result showed fourteen images as part of the Notman Photographic Archives Collection. One of the results is a portrait of John Platt, my 5th great-grandfather.

You can download the image in different resolutions; McCord Museum provides the HTML code so you can link to the image from your own website; you can print, it, send it as a postcard, or order a print for CDN \$20 per image plus shipping and handling and applicable taxes.

As well, the information about the print also proved to be a useful clue as well: "copied for Mr. Skaife". I had no idea if the Skaife family was connected to my tree. Further research determined that John Platt's great-granddaughter, Elizabeth Platt married Adam Skaife. Adam Skaife turns out to be the first non-Molson family member to participate in brewery ownership.
