NEW! BC Vital Events Database

The BC Archives is in the process of unveiling a new vital events database with digital images online at <http://search-collections.royalbcmuseum.bc.ca/Genealogy/BasicSearch>. It went live on September 4 with historical registrations of births from 1854-1903, marriages, 1872-1936 and deaths, 1872-1991.

They were experiencing difficulties between September 6 to 9, but it was up and running again by mid-morning on September 10th. If you log onto the site and have a problem searching, be sure to check back on a regular basis to see if it's working again. I've downloaded a number of the free registrations in jpg form already. Some of the records do not have digital images attached yet but they may in the future.

There is a basic search page with options for first name, last name, and a date range. Or you can do an advanced search that includes name, gender, age, place of event, registration number, and date range. Please note that some of these options only work for certain searches. The bottom half of the advanced search page has a place to enter Bride, Groom, Mother or Father based on whether it's a search for a birth or marriage. You can also browse

the database, which might help if their name is spelled incorrectly. Options with this search are: Browse by either Last name, First name, place or reel number; Words beginning with letters A-Z; or by a single keyword.



Family Search has digital images of the BC marriage registrations online at <https://www.familysearch.org/search/collection/list#page=1®ion=CANADA>.

I'm sure they plan to add images for birth and death registrations as well. These are free to download but you have to register to see the image. Remember that BC records at Family Search do not have the same range of years as the BC Archives. Their database includes the following: Birth Registrations, 1854-1903, Marriage Registrations, 1859-1932, and Death Registrations, 1872-1986.
