The Family History group supports members in researching their family history research. Members have ancestors from around the globe.


They meet on the first Wednesday of each month at 7pm at the Maple Ridge Library.

Mary Ann Wilkinson Hargraves

Mary Ann and Robert had 10 children — 5 children who died untimely deaths according to this monument!



My 3rd great grandmother Mary Ann Wilkinson HARGRAVES, was born in London, about 1808, but was living in Lancashire, when her father Henry gave her permission to marry Robert AINSCOW, a school master, 20 years her senior in 1825. They were married Manchester Cathedral. Mary Ann made her mark, while Robert signed his name. Son John died at 9 months old. Daughter Amelia Ellen, died at 5 months. Daughter Elizabeth Jane died at only 2 weeks old. Son Thomas aged 27 died in 1853 when he was thrown from a horse carriage when the wheel hit a turnpike gate post.

In the 1851 census Mary Ann is a Grocer and a widow. She has 3 sons with her ages 13,11, and 6. In 1854 she married Henry Lawson.

Daughter Sarah Ainscow, born 1828, my second great grandmother, married Joseph HORROCKS in 1853. They had 8 children. Only 2 boys outlived their parents. Thomas who signed his mother's death certificate and Samuel who emigrated to Canada around 1885.

I also found two other children of Sarah and Joseph Horrocks. John Frederick Ainscow Horrocks born in 1863 and another Eliza Adelaide Horrocks born in 1866, both died in 1866. Frederick 3 years and Eliza 3 months.

Daugher Eliza Adelaide Ainscow was born in July 13,1831, She married Issac JENKINSON in 1859. They had 3 boys. Alfred was born in 1860 and died in 1866. Thomas William was born in 1862. He died in 1880. Frederick was born in 1865 and died in 1874. In the 1871 census, I found Issac with the 2 boys and he is listed as a widower. I did find Eliza Adelaide Jenkinson who died in 1870 in Liverpool, but they were living in Hindley, so more checking on this.

FamilySearch Digital Records Access Replacing Microfilm

Thursday, September 7, 2017, marks the closing of an 80-year era of historic records access to usher in a new, digital model. *FamilySearch* is discontinuing its microfilm circulation services in concert with its commitment to make billions of the world's historic records readily accessible digitally online.

The remaining microfilms should be digitized by the end of 2020, and all new records from its ongoing global efforts are already using digital camera equipment.
