
Important LGBTQ+ Terms Matching Activity

This list is incomplete and some definitions may differ

	Definition
Gender Identity	The personal sense of one's own gender.
Sex ——	The set of biological attributes of a person which most often distinguishes them as male or female.
Sexuality	A person's identity in relation to the gender or genders to which they are typically sexually attracted.
Gender Expression	The ways in which a person expresses their gender identity, typically through their appearance, dress, and behaviour.
Romantic Attraction ———	An emotional response that arises from a desire for a romantic relationship with the recipient.
LGBTQ+	An initialism that is often used as an umbrella term.
Lesbian	A woman who is attracted to other women.
Сау ———	A person who is attracted to people of the same gender. It is often used to describe men.
Bisexual	A person who is attracted to men and women.
Transgender	A person who's gender identity differs from their sex.
Queer	An umbrella term for sexual and gender minorities who are not heterosexual or are not cisgender. It is a reclaimed slur whose use is still debated.
Questioning	A person who is unsure of their sexuality, gender or both.
Asexual	A person who rarely or never experiences sexual attraction.
Aromantic ———	A person who rarely or never experiences romantic attraction.
Genderqueer/ Non-Binary	A person who does not subscribe to conventional gender distinctions but identifies with neither, both, or a combination of male and female genders.
Pansexual ———	A person who's sexual attraction is not determined by sex or gender identity.
Intersex ———	A person who does not fit the typical definitions for male or female bodies.
Genderfluid	A person who does not have a fixed gender.
Cis(gender) ———	A person who's gender identity corresponds with their biological sex.



Canadian LGBTQ+ History Timeline

Place the following historic events in Canada's LGBTQ+ history on the timeline.



- 1. The federal government decriminalizes homosexuality (1969)
- 2. Sexual Orientation is included as part of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms (1996)
- 3. The Stonewall Riots happen in New York which brings LGBTQ+ rights into public view (1969)
- 4. Gender identity and expression is included as part of the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms (2017)
- 5. Marriage Equality is passed on a federal level (2005)
- 6. The first pride parade in Canada happens (1971)
- 7. The federal government allows openly gay men and women to serve in the armed forces (1992)
- 8. Policies for blood donation that discriminate against gay and bisexual men are lifted (Has not happened)
- 9. Homosexuality is declassified as a mental illness by the WHO (1990)
- 10. Being trans is declassified as a mental illness by the WHO (2019)
- Conversion therapy becomes illegal on a federal level (Has not happened yet)
- 12. Vancouver celebrates pride for the first time (1973)
- The immigration act no longer prohibits homosexuals from immigrating to Canada (1978)
- 14. The age of consent is equalized for both heterosexual and homosexual acts (2019)
- 15. Trans and non-binary people in BC are able to change the gender markers on their IDs without undergoing surgery (2014)
