LAC Funds Storage Upgrades for Museum

Maple Ridge Historical Society receives DHCP grant

As many of our patrons know, the museum and community archives are housed in heritage buildings, from the 1910s and 1930s respectively. While some upgrades have been made to the buildings with modern electricity and plumbing, limitations remain on sealing up the environment where precious objects and papers are stored. Library and Archives Canada has graciously provided the Society with a grant of \$17,863 as part of the Documentary Heritage Communities Program, enabling the staff to purchase sealed cabinets with climate control, an upright freezer, and a high-capacity dehumidifier.

While this new storage won't hold all of our spectacular objects, it will provide much-needed safe spaces for the most delicate of our holdings, like films, magnet tapes, and materials that need quarantine in deep-freeze conditions as pest control. The primary use for the cabinets will be housing at-risk negatives while they await the long process of digitization.

Supplies are being ordered immediately, but the installation of furniture and rehabilitation will take some months yet, with specialty items on back-order. In the meantime, the archivist and archives assistant will triage and prepare items for their new storage.

We thank Library and Archives Canada for their generosity in helping a small community archives maintain high standards!


