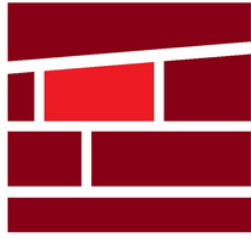

Recently, at the 2023 Heritage Awards, three of our beloved youth volunteers were honoured for their contributions to local heritage. Shengbin Li, Xiaoxiao Zhang, Shaohua (Aaron) Dong volunteered with us in the fall of 2021 translating pages from our website into Mandarin. We are thrilled that they were honoured with a heritage award for their work in helping us reach more people with our local history stories. They are particularly impressive youth because they came to us with this project and set us on a path to bring our stories to an even wider audience. After

completing this project, their idea and work began a larger translation project at the museum. We have begun the process of translating history pages on the website into different languages as well as recording a guided tour of the Maple Ridge Museum and Haney House Museum in multiple languages. At the moment we are recruiting volunteers who speak multiple languages to help us with translation. Top of our list of needed volunteers are those who speak, read, or write Japanese, Finnish, Korean, Punjabi and Farsi. This project helps us with our goal of expanding our definition of heritage and reaching people who live in Maple Ridge today. April 22nd 10am - 2pm

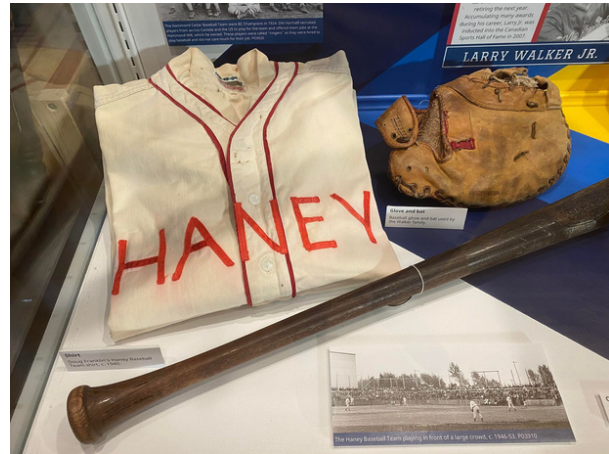
