
CUP AND BALL

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- SMALL PLASTIC OR PAPER CUP
- 5" STRING
- WOODEN BEAD
- SKEWER OR DOWEL
- SCISSORS
- HOT GLUE GUN
- SHARPIE/PAINT/MARKERS (OPTIONAL)
- DECORATE THE OUTSIDE OF THE CUP HOWEVER YOU LIKE.
- USE SCISSORS TO CUT A SMALL HOLE IN THE MIDDLE OF THE BOTTOM OF THE CUP. INSERT DOWEL OR SKEWER AND HOT GLUE IN PLACE.
- TIE ONE END OF THE STRING TO ONE OR TWO WOODEN BEADS IF MORE WEIGHT IS NEEDED.
- TIE THE OTHER END OF THE STRING TO THE DOWEL OR SKEWER,
 RIGHT BELOW THE CUP. USE A DOT OF HOT GLUE TO SECURE IT.
- HOLD THE HANDLE AND TRY TO SWING THE BALL INTO THE CUP!



A CUP AND BALL IS A GREAT WAY TO TEST HAND EYE COORDINATION. THIS TOY IS CALLED BOLICHE IN SPAIN, CAPIRUCHO IN EL SALVADOR, BILBOQUET IN FRANCE, AND BALERO IN MANY HISPANIC-SPEAKING AREAS. A SIMILAR TOY WITH THREE CUPS AND A SPIKE IS CALLED A KENDAMA IN JAPAN.
