



## What's in a Name?


Neighbourhoods are often named after specific people who lived, there or after places or things that are found in the area. Try to match the neighbourhood to their name's origin.


- This neighbourhood is named after the first European settler there: Thomas Haney. This neighbourhood also makes up most of what is now Downtown Maple Ridge.
- 2. This neighbourhood was named after John McIver's Farm: Maple Ridge.
- 3. This neighbourhood between Haney and Whonnock reportedly got its name from a passing American.
- 4. This neighbourhood is named after the Hammond brothers who settled in the area.
- 5. This neighbourhood was named after James Murray Webster.
- 6. This neighbourhood was named after a different neghbourhood of England: Yennadon Down.
- 7. This neighbourhood was named after the Whonnock Indigenous people who lived in the area.
- 8. This neighbourhood was named after the British Philosopher John Ruskin
