#### MUSIC ON THE WHARF LINEUP

This event started in 1997 with a local band offering to play a one-time concert and has become one of the Maple Ridge Historical Society's most popular annual events. During the last 22 years this event has brought in amazing local and regional bands, and this year is no different.

The summer begins July 15 with the inimitable sound of the bluegrass band, Jackson Hallow, and is followed on July 29 by vocal power house, and CBC's Vinyl Cafe stars Reid Jamieson Band.

August 12 brings back the popular 12 piece Bruce James Orchestra, while August 26 concludes the season with the dynamic and engaging fivepiece indie-soul band Lincoln Street Union.
