Online City Directories

Over the past year I have been able to make good use of the British Columbia city directories which are available online through the Vancouver Public Library at www.vpl.ca/bccd/index.php

Directories are available for the years 1860 to 1935. The majority of the detailed listings are for the greater Vancouver area, however there are pleasant surprises finding listings for other municipalities as well.

The crisscross feature of the Vancouver directories proved valuable when I was seeking several families. People are listed alphabetically by surname in one section and another section lists street names and numbers and the names of the residents. My grandparents lived at 218 Union Street for a few years. I "lost" them in the 1936 and 1937 BC & *Yukon Directories* because their non-English name was so badly corrupted by the enumerator. On checking the street name and address section, and through a little mental contortion of sounding out the surname listed, I was confident I had found them still at the same address.

The alphabetical section also included my grandfather's occupation and the names of employers. Looking up the employers' names in the

directories, I was able to see what type of business they conducted.

A family of cousins with a different surname was proving to be elusive in the alphabetical section. By looking at the street address section for the approximate years I thought they had lived on Fleming Street, I located the family. Working my way backwards through the years I discovered they had lived at one address for close to 20 years, however their surname had been spelled incorrectly.

I recently helped a friend seeking information about his family who had lived in Langley Prairie. The directories revealed that a grandfather had operated a hotel, that he was the station agent for the Interurban, and the occupations of his children. My friend had wondered where his widowed grandfather had met his second wife who was from England. The directories revealed that in the few years before their marriage she was living close-by with her sister and brother-in-law.

A drawback of searching for non-English names is that they can be misspelled, often residents are listed as "foreigners" or by their ethnic origin rather than by name, or in the case of boarding houses not all residents are listed. The directories are still a valuable resource for locating families. Check them out.
