#### 1901 Irish Census

On June 2, the 1901 Irish Census joined the 1911 Irish Census online at The National Archives of Ireland; you can search, view and download original images from their website for free.

Search results include Surname, Forename, Townland/Street, District Electoral Division (DED), County, Age and Sex. When you click on the hyperlink name it takes you to a full list of the household. This page also includes a link to the original census return for the family. Another link includes a page with a list of heads of household per street and another for additional buildings, etc on the property.

My Gibson family has been a difficult line to trace, especially since most branches of this family moved around a lot. However, I've known for a few years that my Gibson's were living at Belfast, Northern Ireland in 1901. I was waiting patiently for the census records to go online so I could readily access these documents.

To my surprise I found my Gibson family living at 15 Sydney Street West in Belfast. My great aunt's birth registration from April 15, 1901 states that the family lived at 10 Sydney Street West. She was registered the same day she was born by her father. Her birth was two weeks after this census was taken.

The biggest surprise I discovered while searching these census records was to find another great aunt and her family were living just down the street at 3 Sydney Street West. I found her husband in the 1901 Scottish Census with his parents at Renfrew, Scotland previously. And I had searched for her in the Scottish census, to no avail. Now I know why – she was in Belfast at the time. Her husband was likely just visiting his parents the night the census was taken.

I solved one mystery but uncovered different one. I found listed with my great aunt another daughter named Kitty, who was 8 months old; she was born in Scotland. What happened to her? She most likely died young. I'll have to see what I can uncover about her life.

F.W. Rounsefell was a partner in the insurance company Ceperly, Rounsefell & Co. so I thought I would search for images of the building on 739 West Hastings Street. From the VPL site I entered "rounsefell" into the search box and found four images of the building.

I did the same search on the City of Vancouver Archives site and to my surprise was rewarded with two images of F. W. Rounsfell as part of a rugby team and one as a member of the Vancouver Club.

However, the most exciting find is a photo of Dunthwaite Private School for young ladies at the corner of Dunsmuir Street and Seymour Street from 1890. In the photo is my great-grandmother, Daisy Rounsefell, her sister Mary Rounsefell, and, a new addition to my tree, their second cousin Elsie De Wolf.

The image description provides married names for the girls so I have been able to trace Elsie De Wolf as Mrs. Montieth.
