Scotland's People Website Update

The announcement arrived! *Scotland's People* had updated their website to make it more user friendly. As someone who has two family tree lines back to Scotland, this was welcome news so I had to check it out.

The first thing noticed was the website came across as a more welcoming invitation rather than the strict librarian type. I was encouraged to change my moniker to my email address and change my password to my choice. My credits were still available to me as well as the searches I had already done and the saved images. Bonus, where I had trouble viewing before, I had no trouble viewing the images any longer! When viewing, the tool bar to manage the image (crop, change size etc.) is in an easy area to assist you.

Now to play. I chose to look for my grandfather as John Miller is a fairly common name. The immediate search with his name and a year range of over 100 years netted over 300,000 hits. The nice thing was I could tell just how many hits for each category whether it was a birth, death or specific census. By choosing the 1911 census, the results were down to 1,500 results.

The great new feature is that now I was shown the entire list and the county and/or city for free! Adding the area of Caithness brought it down to 76. By using the advanced search I was given the opportunity to add another forename which should be part of the family grouping. Thank you Aunt Dolina. With her name I could zero in on the correct census page from the correct county. This was so much easier than

previous searching. Now if I wanted to view, it would cost 6 credits (an increase but it is a small increase for going to the correct page first try). A great addition are the "tips" offered to help. They can be turned off if desired.

Purchasing credits come in 30 or 40 blocks and have increased in price. The increase is nominal and when you consider you previously paid just to view the results pages first, it really is not much different. Credits are are for 2 years until they go locked until more are purchased. The expiry date is well marked. Each type of image has a different credit value.

The website also has interesting articles available such as irregular marriage, Victorian gymnasiums, early cinema and the Balmoral estate to name a few. They have pages to read like guides on reading older handwriting, weights and measures, numbers and sums of money, surnames, forenames as well as unfamiliar words and phrases.

The website also makes available the opportunity for ordering copies of the documents or certificates.

Whether you prefer to search for people, or a place, or through the image library, you have the option. You can learn about the social history, local history as well as house and building history.

I cannot say that more records are available at this time other than the BMD, census, valuation rolls and legal records. More records will be added in the near future from the National Records of Scotland (check out their website for what they have if you travel to Scotland) but for now I have a lot of information to play.

First I need to read the will of my 5x great grandfather, Peter Mayoh!
