- 1. This neighbourhood is named after the first European settler there:


 Thomas Haney. This neighbourhood also makes up most of what is now Downtown

- 4. This neighbourhood is named after the Hammond brothers who settled in the area.
- 5. This neighbourhood was named after James Murray Webster.
- 6. This neighbourhood was named after a different neghbourhood of England: Yennadon Down.
- 7. This neighbourhood was named after the Whonnock Indigenous people who lived in the area.
- 8. This neighbourhood was named after the British Philosopher John Ruskin


The Legend of Legends
